With OpenDNS, SCVI achieves CIPA (Children's Internet Protection Act) compliance, a requirement for government E-Rate funding.

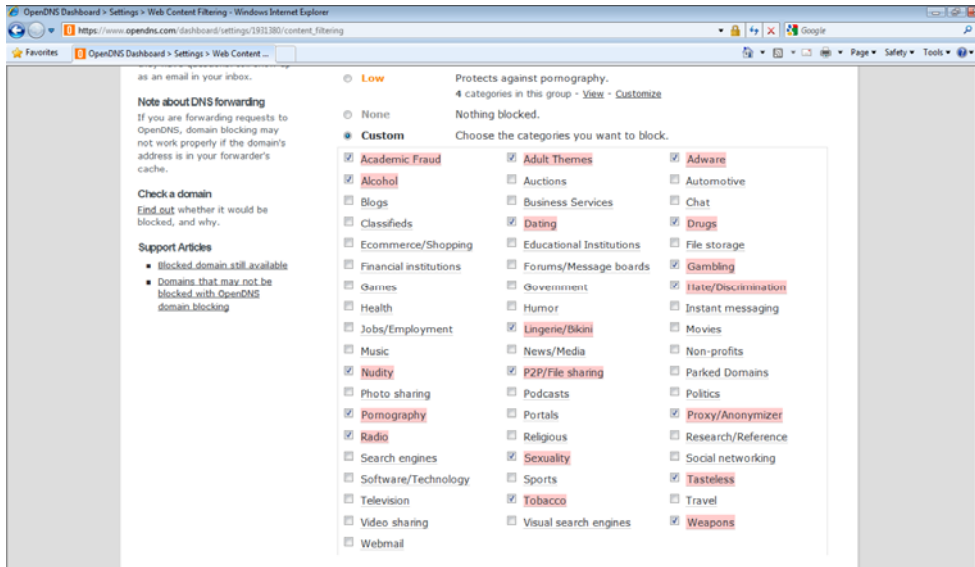


Parents can provide their children the same Internet protection at home as we provide at SCVI. OpenDNS has a **FREE** easy to use household web content filter.
